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## POOL OPENS MAY 25, 2019

*Yes, it is finally Spring, both on the calendar, and in the weather!*

The Glenwood Pool Opens on Saturday, May 25, 2019 at 11am.

Please be sure to get your Recreation cards out early so that you have them ready when you want to go to the pool. We still have many at the office waiting for pick up from last year. **You MUST bring your Rec card to the pool or admittance will not be granted.** Please plan ahead. If you are bringing a child from the neighborhood, you **MUST** also have their card. If they live in Glenwood they are **NOT A GUEST** and will not be able to use a guest card in place of a recreation card.

There is a limit of **five** guests per household, **and you must be in attendance with your guest.**

Rec cards will be validated at the beginning of June. Assessments must be up to date.

Please **KEEP YOUR CARDS** from year to year. Everyone age two and older will need a card. Scheduled photo dates are on calendar inside. Replacement cards are \$5.00. If your card is damaged, you may bring to the office for replacement at no charge.

### \*\*POOL GUEST PASSES FOR 2019 SEASON\*\*

As noted before the pool closed, the guest pass punch cards are still valid. If you have not yet purchased a guest pass card, please do so as soon as possible. The guest fee is still \$2 per guest, and cards are either a 5 punch (\$10) or a 10 punch (\$20) card. The cards do not expire, and are not transferrable. They must be purchased using **cash (exact change) or money order.** No money will be accepted at the pool for guests.

SeeClickFix



SeeClickFix is a 311 request and work management app bridging the communication gap between residents and their local governments. You can Google SeeClickFix Virginia Beach to report problems, such as potholes, sidewalk issues, street light outages, etc. VBGov.com also has a problem reporting page. If you go on to the website and search “report a problem”, the page will come up to enter the information, and even upload photos. Updates will be given after the info is reported. There is also an Android and Apple app for VBWorks that you can download from the Play Store for you phone.

## Outdoor Water Conservation Tips

Even though we use water every day, it’s easy to take it for granted. Just imagine how you would function without clean water. It’s everyone’s responsibility to conserve and protect water resources. The decisions and actions you make today truly affect our water resources for the future. The following suggestions will help you get in the habit of saving water in the great outdoors:

Get a rain gauge to measure rainfall. One inch of rain per week is generally sufficient for lawns and gardens. Supplement only when rainfall is inadequate.

Use mulch around landscape plantings. Mulch will help eliminate weeds and hold moisture in the soil.

Select hardy plants that don’t need much water. Native plants that are well adapted to your climate and soils will survive well without supplemental watering.

Water during the cool part of the day to avoid rapid evaporation.

Raise the mowing heights on your lawn mower. This promotes healthier grass that can better survive dry periods. When watering is necessary, water slowly and thoroughly. If you notice puddles or runoff, turn water off and wait for water to soak in. Also be sure your sprinkler puts water where you need it—not on driveways or sidewalks.

Wash cars efficiently. First give the car a quick rinse, and then turn the water off. Wash one section of the car at a time and rinse that section quickly. Turn the water off each time.

Conserving water is good for the environment, and also good for your wallet!





## TRASH AND TRASH CONTAINERS

As most of you know, the Association has regulations regarding the storage of trash cans, as they cannot be visible from neighboring property. The City of Virginia Beach has regulations regarding the time that trash cans may be placed out for collection, and the Association adheres to these times. Following is the section of the Code of the City of Virginia Beach in this regard:

Sec. 31-28. - Points of collection.

*Privately owned residential refuse receptacles, including automated refuse receptacles and containers for recyclables, oversized household trash and bulky items such as refrigerators, water heaters, washing machines, other household appliances, furniture, mattresses and similar items, the contents of which are to be collected by the city or a city contractor, shall be placed on the curb line of a city right-of-way **no earlier than 5:00 p.m. on the day before collection** and by 7:00 a.m. on the day of collection. **All receptacles must be removed out of view of the public after collection on the day of collection**, except as otherwise designated by the city manager or his designee.*

Please note that placing the containers at the curb or in the street prior to 5PM the day before collection constitutes a violation of City Code and of the Declaration. This includes all bulky items, for which a work order must be submitted if it is an item to be removed by the City. There are some items, such as carpet, that will not be removed by the City, and you must have a contractor remove it immediately. These items cannot be stored on the curb at any time. We are reminding you of this as residents can be cited for a trash can violation if the cans are on the street prior to 5PM the day before collection, and at any other time other than the day of collection. Additionally, they must be removed from view, and not just from the street.



## BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND—HONEYBEE CART PATHS

We have previously published this information in regard to utilization of the cart paths. **We are again providing the information, as some residents are not clear on the rules.**

The Honeybee Golf Course winds its way through many areas of Glenwood. There appears to be some confusion as to the permissions granted to Glenwood residents in regard to access to the grounds of the golf course. **Residents are allowed to walk on the cart paths only when the course is closed.** Closing is evidenced by the removal of the flags from the holes. **THE CART PATHS ARE THE ONLY PART OF THE GOLF COURSE THAT CAN BE ACCESSED AFTER HOURS.** Being on any other part of the golf course is considered **trespassing**, and you will be subject to any and all action that the golf course chooses to take.

PLEASE-do not allow your dogs to run loose and/or defecate on the golf course. This is a violation of city code, and you can be issued a summons. All pet waste must be removed, regardless of where it is dropped.

On the flip side—golfers are not allowed to retrieve their golf balls from your yard. If a golfer trespasses on your property, you have the right to take action against him or her.

## KEEP YOUR PET COOL IN THE DOG DAYS OF SUMMER



The "dog days of summer" is a phrase used to describe the hot and humid days of summer. It can be traced back thousands of years to the days of the Roman Empire. It refers to the dates from July 03 through August 11, which is 20 days prior and 20 days after the star Sirius rises and falls in conjunction with the sun. Sirius was known as the "Dog Star", because it is the brightest star in the constellation Canis Major (Large Dog).

The dangerous heat and humidity of these "dog days" can be harmful to not only humans, but human's best friend and other animals as well. Pets are considered family to many people, and in the event of an emergency, sometimes people will not evacuate if their pets have to be left behind. To gather information on how to protect your pets this summer, the National Weather Service reached out to Donnie Embrey, the Team Leader for Louisa Virginia Community Animal Response Team. Donnie and his team are part of a non-profit organization dedicated to emergency preparedness, response and management specifically focused on preparedness and response for pets and their owners. Here are a few things to keep in mind during the "dog days" this summer to help keep your pets safe."

Pets, just like humans, are susceptible to heat illness - make sure to keep your animals hydrated! For dogs, Donnie says "A good general guideline is that a healthy dog should drink between ½ and 1 ounce of water per pound of body weight each day under normal conditions. Of course, any pet will need more water on hot and humid days and your pet's age, hair type, level of activity, medical history and any prior history of a prior heat related illness may dictate that your pet needs more water than the average dog." When it comes to diet, Donnie says "reducing a pet's food intake on warmer days can help the pet cope with the heat, especially reducing the intake of grain based foods that cause a metabolic spike in body temperature." A common misconception is that giving your pet a buzz cut in the summer is a good idea, but that may not be best for your pet. "A pet's coat acts as insulation, it keeps it warm in the winter and cool in the summer by blocking the heat of the sun from reaching the skin." For example, "the several layers of the dog's coat keep the heat out and air circulating. If you remove the natural cooling process the dog will have a harder time coping with the heat." Check with a veterinarian or professional groomer to find out what's best for your pet.

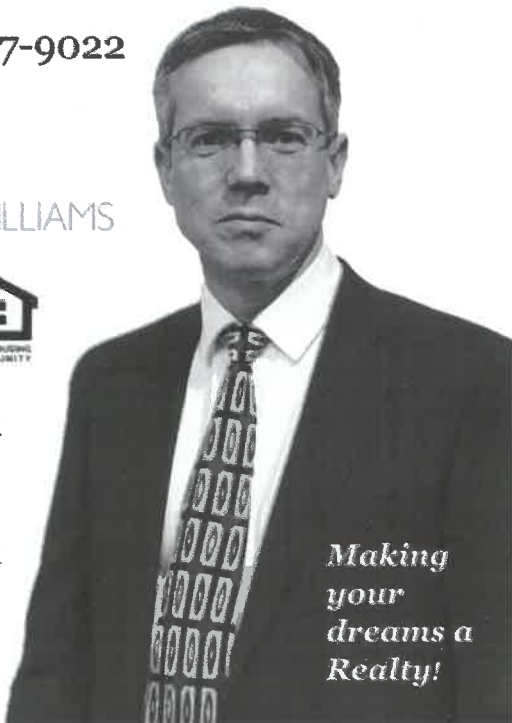
